JRA to run at full steam again

JRA will be returning to a full staff compliment to attend to service delivery issues.

Ward councillors across Region B have been left with very few answers to give their residents and motorists when it came to concerns of reinstatements and potholes filling in their areas. For weeks such matters have been reported to ward councillors and the Johannesburg Road Agency (JRA), although some had been attended, a majority of cases remained unresolved.

MMC for Transport Funzela Ngobeni announced roadrelated service delivery is set for a major boost across Johannesburg as JRA depot workers were set to return to work on a full-time basis from February 16. He said due to JRA not being declared an essential service at the start of the Covid-19 pandemic, the agency has not been able to run at 100% capacity, affecting service delivery. This is expected to change following the directive issued by the City of Joburg's acting city manager Floyd Brink that such entities have all their workers reporting for duty.

Ngobeni said, "On the employee front, for almost two years, the entity has been forced to operate with two-thirds of

its usual workforce of general workers at any given time. I, therefore, welcome the decision to issue a directive instructing all JRA employees, especially general workers normally stationed at the City's depots, to return to work on a full-time basis with immediate effect."

Prior to the directive, JRA was unable to produce asphalt to carry out crucial repairs of potholes and road resurfacing due to employees working on a rotational basis. The MMC will now shift his focus and energy to rolling out the A Re Sebetseng region-by-region service delivery blitz campaigns and said the additional manpower will ensure that service requests logged by residents will be addressed quicker than before.

JRA aims to address the backlog of potholes and other road defects around Joburg over the next few weeks. This includes installing and repairing deep patching, faulty or vandalised traffic signals, road markings, blocked kerb inlets, potholes and guardrails. Two Diepsloot schools were visited by Diepsloot police, community patrollers Community Policing Forum and West Rand K9 Unit on February 16.


Diepsloot Police Station spokesperson Captain Tinyiko Mathebula said the schools were Diepsloot West Secondary School and Diepsloot Combined School.



Douglasdale police's acting Station Commander Colonel Moeti Senna said the day was about engaging with the community and was a success.

He said, "We want to ensure the trust we have in the community continues, because if you don't review the trust, things become stagnant. Crime-wise, there is crime that is happening in the area. But you will find in some space, there is not that much because we are working with the security companies. We need to work hand-in-hand with the community, and that is what we are trying to do especially with working with the security companies in the area."

Douglasdale CPF Sector 4 public relations officer Frieda Boils echoed Senna's statements on the morning's events. "Very few people come to the police when they need to report a crime, either to the police or to JMPD. But we've seen people come here today to talk to the police," she said.

"We want people to not fear the police, especially since we've seen them in casual surroundings today. Going forward, we as a CPF sector would like to have more events in a social setting.'

Jamal Musiitwa, programme coordinator of Coffee with a Cop worked with Itlhokomeleng Batho Rehabilitation Centre, the NGO that started the Coffee with a Cop concept. He said the concept of the event was to bridge the gap between community members and police, and had been running for the past five years.

The next Coffee with a Cop event is set to take place next month in Randburg.

Share your kidney, save a life

A Lonehill resident is appealing to people far and wide for the donation of a kidney after receiving news that her kidney function was in decline.

Chanel Fourie (32) was born with polycystic kidney disease and was left with one functioning kidney which has since been replaced twice the first time when she was six years old and again when she was 11.

In 2020, Fourie received the news that her kidney function was starting to decline due to the discovery of an autoimmune disease that was attacking her organ.

She said the typical life expectancy of a transplanted kidney was about 10 years, but she managed to live a perfectly normal life for double that. "I was devastated when I found out the news. Everything had gone really well and I had lived the most wonderful life. I had been able to carry on with life and go out with friends.

"When we treated the autoimmune disease, we knew time was limited with the second [transplanted] kidney. Back then I was at around 88% of kidney function, and as of today I am at about 26%. There has been quite a decline since last vear as I had also contracted Covid-19."

Fourie said she had found

out the bad news shortly after the passing of her nephrologist which had made her more fearful of what was to come. However, working with a new specialist at Morningside Medi Clinic had given her hope that she would find a living donor.

"I'm a lover of life. There is something in my mind that says I should keep going. I have this belief that everything is going to be okay, because everything has gone well in my life.

"I just have a lot of positivity. I think when God was dealing all His little problems to me, He gave me positivity because He knew that will keep me going.'

Fourie said her daily routine included checking her blood pressure every morning and taking medication. Should she get the needed transplant, Fourie said she wanted to live with a sense of freedom. "I absolutely love travelling, and with Covid I haven't be able to. I've also been too scared to in case I don't have direct access to my doctor or my team at Morningside Medi Clinic. It will take a huge weight off my shoulders.

Residents clean up

Community members came together to clear up debris that accumulated after recent heavy rains.

Douglasdale Community Policing Forum (CPF) Sector 1 members and Jukskei Park residents took to Platina Street bridge on February 12 to remove debris and dead trees swept in from heavy rains.

With heavy rains plaguing the city on February 4, there have been flooding issues which saw a number of trees flow into the river and block the bridge.

The CPF and community members had previously cleared the bridge last month after it flooded, but it did not disrupt the flow of traffic due to it still being the festive season. Public relations officer in the Sector 1 CPF Michael Tuck said community members came together to clean and remove the debris with a TLB machine thanks to the partnership of the Jukskei

Park Community Forum and the CPF.

"When the rains happened on that Friday night [February 4], we had to block traffic because the water was coming over the bridge. We knew we had to clear the bridge on a weekend when there's no rain forecasted. We would not have lasted if the bridge had flooded again," he said.

"If we lose this bridge, then we are in serious trouble because it is our main through road. This clean-up is much bigger than the one we had in January."

The hired TLB machine lifted and dragged out big and medium-sized pieces of dead trees from the river blocking the bridge, which was then cut into smaller pieces with chainsaws.

The work began for the CPF and community members from 07:00 until just after 15:00 and had a lot of assistance from younger community members who also cleaned along the river banks while the bridge was cleared.

HPV vaccination drive begins

HPV vaccination campaign launched in Gauteng schools.

The Gauteng Department of Health is on a mission to vaccinate as many young girls as possible against the human papillomavirus (HPV).

The department informed and reminded parents, caregivers and legal guardians of school girls that are in Grade 5 or nine years old and above that the campaign will take place between February 14 and March 14 at all public primary schools.

This will be the first round of the campaign and is aimed at protecting girls from developing cervical cancer later in life according to the department. Learners who are not reached during this first period will be vaccinated when schools re-open on April 5. The second dose of HPV vaccine will be given after six months, between September 2 to October 31 later this year.

According to the health department, HPV is a common virus that can infect both men and women and could eventually cause cervical cancer later in life. There are over 200 types of HPV viruses and research has shown that HPV types 16 and 18 account for 70% of cervical cancer cases. The Cervarix HPV vaccine is given bi-annually and is very safe and effective in preventing HPV types 16 and 18 strains of the virus.

Parents, caregivers and legal guardians are urged to sign the relevant consent forms to ensure their children do not miss out on the HPV vaccination drive.

They added that a consent form that is signed at the beginning of the year is valid for the whole year. This consent form will also be used for routine health assessments as part of the Integrated School Health Programme (ISHP). The ISHP includes provision of health education, eye, ear, oral assessments, catch-up immunisations as well as deworming, including identification of any other health barriers.

The department reiterated that the consent form for the ISHP and HPV campaigns will not be used for Covid-19 vaccination programme.





Food donations for those who need it

"An enormous amount of work goes on behind the scenes. We have had teams working long hours every day for the past couple of weeks to package the parcels and sort out logistics, all so that we can make sure every family receives their parcel," concluded Plumari.

Bricks to build the future

About 20 000 eco-bricks and two years later, a building stands in Diepsloot that enriches the lives of local youths and its all thanks to you, community members and organisations.

Diana Musara is the director of Khensani's Collection, an NPO based in Diepsloot that offers extra lessons to children in Grade 1 to matric with a focus on Stem subjects (science, technology, engineering and mathematics).

For the past two years, the organisation has taught in a building solely made from eco-bricks that were collected in communities such as Berario, schools such as St. Stithians, and organisations like The Rotary Club of Randburg, to name a few of all who stepped to make a difference.

Musara at Berario Recreational Centre shared how this building came to be and the importance of it in communities much like Diepsloot. Musara explained that though her organisation was helping close to 70 children in the area, she faced two challenges, first, that after matric children usually did not have the funds to study further and second, that the space designated for learning was getting too small. "It was also made of zinc which meant it would either be too hot in the summer or too cold in the winter."

Therefore, the organisation began an entrepreneurship programme, that would focus on them gaining a skill using their hands, and later began looking to an additional building.

It was then that she came across the concept of eco-bricks and thought this was a great replacement to the conventional brick. While doing research into eco-bricks, the organisation saw how the community was

ravaged by litter, and found even greater impetus to build this structure with the use of this recyclable material so as to show the community how trash can have a purpose. "But, with any community, seeing is believing, so when you say to them you can build with a bottle they'll think you crazy."

The Bryanston resident said after the success of the first building they are now looking at building another four with the use of eco-bricks. With help from organisations like Earthly Touch Solutions, who educate the community about pollution and its effects, they know they are changing mindsets around waste. Other organisations assist too – Khuthaza Foundation and Earthly

From ugly dump to green profit

A Diepsloot-based NPO has turned a dumping site into 1.5 hectares of vegetable-producing land and is now reaping the benefits.

Founder of Riverside Sustainable Solutions Sibusiso Kekana said the support from a few companies in the area had been key to the growth of the business since starting from humble beginnings.

"It was one of the 'newborns' that came from the pandemic because I had to think of a way to make money and feed my family. With the success of the farm, we have been able to expand," he told the *Fourways Review*.

"With this space being our first farm, we had to pay for everything out of our own pockets, from water, irrigation, piping and much more. We are grateful that the success has led to the farm effectively paying for itself."

The farm currently has crops of

chomolia which is a type of spinach typically farmed in Zambia and Zimbabwe, as well as okra and spinach, that is currently being supplied to various shops in Alexandra and Diepsloot.

Kekana said a greater variety of vegetables would be planted soon. The owners and developers of the land where Kekana has set up his farm have also made an additional 15 hectares available to make this goal possible.

Kekana has six permanent employees and was confident that with progress more could be employed.

With the expansion, Kekana hoped to supply early childhood development (ECD) centres with food.

"I've spoken to the chairperson of ECDs here in Riverside as we have the intention of targeting crèches so that we can get the young children there the food and nutrition they need."

"They were exceptional today. The level of route control in a mass participation event is dependent on the numbers in personnel and depth of their operational plan," he said.

"It's very challenging and intricate to create a new race blueprint. In this instance, even more so to get our cyclists safely through the urban areas around Montecasino."

The event was presented by De Villiers National Cycling and Lenick Promotions in collaboration with Montecasino, Joburg Metro and Mogale City Metro police.
